How the idea developed

During Welcome Week, students had asked whether the library ran a book club.


We decided our book club would:

Organising Promotion and Planning

- We created a Library Book Club channel on Teams
- Teams Channel grew to 12 library staff participants





The first book club meeting







The first meeting

- Icebreaker -bring a book that means something to you
- Free tea/coffee/biscuits
- Held in a large, easily accessible space on the ground floor
- Talked about library's fiction collection and revealed first group read
- Feedback box with option to provide contact details and book recommendations

Picking a group read

- 6 books selected from our Kortext fiction collection
- Voting polls posted on Instagram and other promotion channels
- Winning book was announced at the first meeting
- Book suggestions from feedback forms were taken into account for the second group read
- Process repeated for the next group read



Where it's going

Both meetings so far have been well attended and enjoyed

We hope it will become a regular quarterly event and plan to:

- Network with the SU
- Connect with wellbeing and multi-faith groups
- Possibly promote during Clubs and Societies day at Welcome Week
